KAISER WINS 3 BRITS

KAISER WILHELM II was celebrating last night after winning three awards at this year's Brits.

Shrugging off his nation's defeat in the Great War and his forced abdication, the Kaiser thanked "all our fans around the world".

Speaking from exile in the Netherlands, the Kaiser also thanked his management team, including General Ludendorff and Field Marshal Hindenburg. Central European nobility has

GREAT WAR? IT WAS SUPER!

PM HAILS 'BEST CONFLICT IN HISTORY'

WAR: Great!

PRIME MINISTER Mr David Lloyd George last night declared the Great War — which ended two days ago — "a peach of a conflict".

Addressing City gentlemen at the Mansion House in London, the tousle-haired Welshman announced: "Without doubt the recent War was the finest military escapade in the long history of the human race.

"It had everything, including — and I really cannot thank them enough for their contribution — a bloodthirsty enemy with comedy moustaches and

spikes upon their helmets. The spikes were inspired, a lovely touch."

During a question and answer session, the Prime Minister was asked what he liked most about the Great War.

After a moment's reflection, Mr Lloyd George replied: "If I had to pick out one thing it would be the guns that go 'rat-a-tat-tat'. In no previous conflict have we had so many cheery, brave Tommies going over the top to the stirring refrain of the guns that go 'rat-a-tat-tat'.

"It made you proud to be British. Seriously, the whole War was fantastic. I honestly couldn't fault a thing."

A jubilant Mr Lloyd George continued: "Back In 1914, we all thought it would

be over by Christmas. As it turned out, we have enjoyed more than four wonderful years of larks and high jinks. We do not know how lucky we are."

Mr Lloyd George's beaming audience applauded loudly before breaking into a spontaneous chorus of "For he's a jolly good fellow!"

The PM later went on to criticise those who had dwelled on the less-agreeable aspects of the conflict, such as the mutilation of Belgian nuns, the use of poison gas and the slaughter of the flower of English manhood.

"There's always someone who focusses on the negative," Mr Lloyd George scolded, cheerily.

OK, OK HAVE THE BLOODY VOTE!

Nagging Suffragettes get own way

WOMEN ARE to be given the vote "if only to stop their infernal bloody yapping", the Home Secretary revealed in Parliament on Thursday.

An exasperated Mr Herbert Samuel told MPs that he was "sick to the back teeth of blasted women banging on about the vote, morning, noon and night".

He added: "Since 1906, all we have heard is 'suffrage for all' and 'votes for women'. Well, I for one have had a bellyful of it!

"Have the vote if that will shut you up. Just pack in the incessant

whining, chaining yourselves to the railings of Parliament and throwing yourselves into the path of the King's horse.

"It's not that big a deal, you know, voting. It just means writing a cross in a box every five years, it's no great shakes. But if it will shut you up, go ahead and vote. I'm not stopping you."

Suffragette leaders last night welcomed the concession, but went on to ask the Home Secretary when he was going to put that shelf up. "For the love of the living Christ, woman! Will you give it a rest?" erupted Mr Samuel.



Fury over Lenin 'we're bigger than Jesus' claim

THE LEADER of the Bolshevik Revolution in Russia caused outrage last night by claiming his Marxist zealots were "bigger than Jesus".

Vladimir Ilyich Lenin told a cheering mob at the Winter Palace in St Petersburg: "Christianity will go. It will vanish and shrink. I needn't argue about that. I'm right and I will be proved right. The proletarian crusade to seize the means of production from the bourgeoisie is more popular than Jesus now."

Last night the Archbishop of Canterbury the Rt Rev Randall Thomas Davidson said: "This is the sort of talk we have come to expect from godless, drug-crazed, hippy Communist dictators."

SPANIARDS TO BE CULLED IN FLU PANIC

ALL SPANIARDS in Britain are to be culled in a bid to halt the progress of Spanish "flu", the Government announced.

Spaniards are requested to assemble at their local police station where they will be given a final meal of tortillas and gazpacho before being dispatched by a single bullet to the head.

The public are being asked to stay alert for signs of "Spanishness", which include hot-headedness, assaults on bulls, lethargy and feminine hairiness.

Any evidence of Spanishness should be reported to the nearest constable.
